If Your Child Attends a Licensed Child Care Program

Children's Inclusion Services (Halton Region)

Children's Inclusion Services offers support for children from birth to age 12 who may experience disabilities, developmental differences, or who are at risk for delays. These services are designed to promote participation and success in licensed child care settings.

- **Resource Consultants** collaborate with families, educators, and community professionals to ensure inclusive learning environments.
- Support includes developmental assessments, consultation, and service coordination tailored to your child's needs and strengths.

If Your Child Is Not Enrolled in a Licensed Child Care Program

Infant and Child Development Services (Halton Region)

This program supports families with children from birth to school entry who are not in licensed care and who have diagnosed or potential developmental differences.

• Services include early intervention, family support, and guidance to help your child grow and thrive at home and in the community.

If Your Child Has a Developmental Disability and Lives at Home

Central West Specialized Developmental Services (CWSDS)

CWSDS is the first point of contact for families with children or youth (up to age 18) who are seeking services and supports related to developmental disabilities.

• Support includes service coordination, community referrals, and access to developmental programs.

Reach Out Centre for Kids (ROCK)

ROCK provides inclusive mental health and developmental supports for children and youth from birth to age 17, along with their families and caregivers.
